WINE OF MOLDOVA, A SUCCESS STORY FROM EASTERN EUROPE, CRAFTED FOR YOU TO ENJOY

Moldovan wine today brings a fresh modern face. Its new generation wines are actually rooted in a rich and complex history, giving the authenticity that so many wine drinkers are looking for today. At the same time, it can offer unique and sometimes surprising wines, especially blends of international and indigenous grape varieties, a true expression of Moldovan terroir and offering something fascinating to wine drinkers seeking out new tastes and styles. "Wine of Moldova" today is the very real result of this country reinventing its approach to wine - focusing on quality, consistency and 'enjoyment-in-a-glass' as its priorities. As an additional sign of confidence for consumers, this national wine brand, with its stork logo, has become a quality symbol legally enforced by the National Office for Vine and Wine and only wines that pass rigorous quality control checks may display it.

The National Office for Vine and Wine was established in 2013 and, and ever since, it has undertaken to support increasing exports of quality wines to more and more markets around the world. It has worked with wine producers to set up a system of protected geographical indications based on the EU model. These cover the three winegrowing regions of **Valul lui Traian, Ștefan Vodă** and **Codru** as well as a category of **Divin** for the country's wine brandies. Moldovan wine has undergone a complete revolution in improving wine quality over the last decade, with clear proof shown by over 500 medals awarded to Moldovan wines in 2018 at renowned international wine

competitions such as: Decanter World Wine Awards, Mundus Vini, Concours Mondial de Bruxelles, International Wine Challenge and more.

Moldova has the highest density of vineyards in the world and can offer a variety of wines to meet just about every taste. It grows both international and indigenous local varieties including Viorica, Rară Neagră, Fetească Neagră, Fetească Albă and Fetească Regală. But perhaps the most unique and exciting are the blends where Moldovan winemakers can express their individuality and the Moldovan landscape, all with a local twist.

The National Office for Vine and Wine is proud of its contribution towards helping the wine industry to rethink and reform, and to ensuring its wines meet international quality standards. Wine of Moldova is a sign of that change as well as a symbol of our commitment to our customers and business partners.

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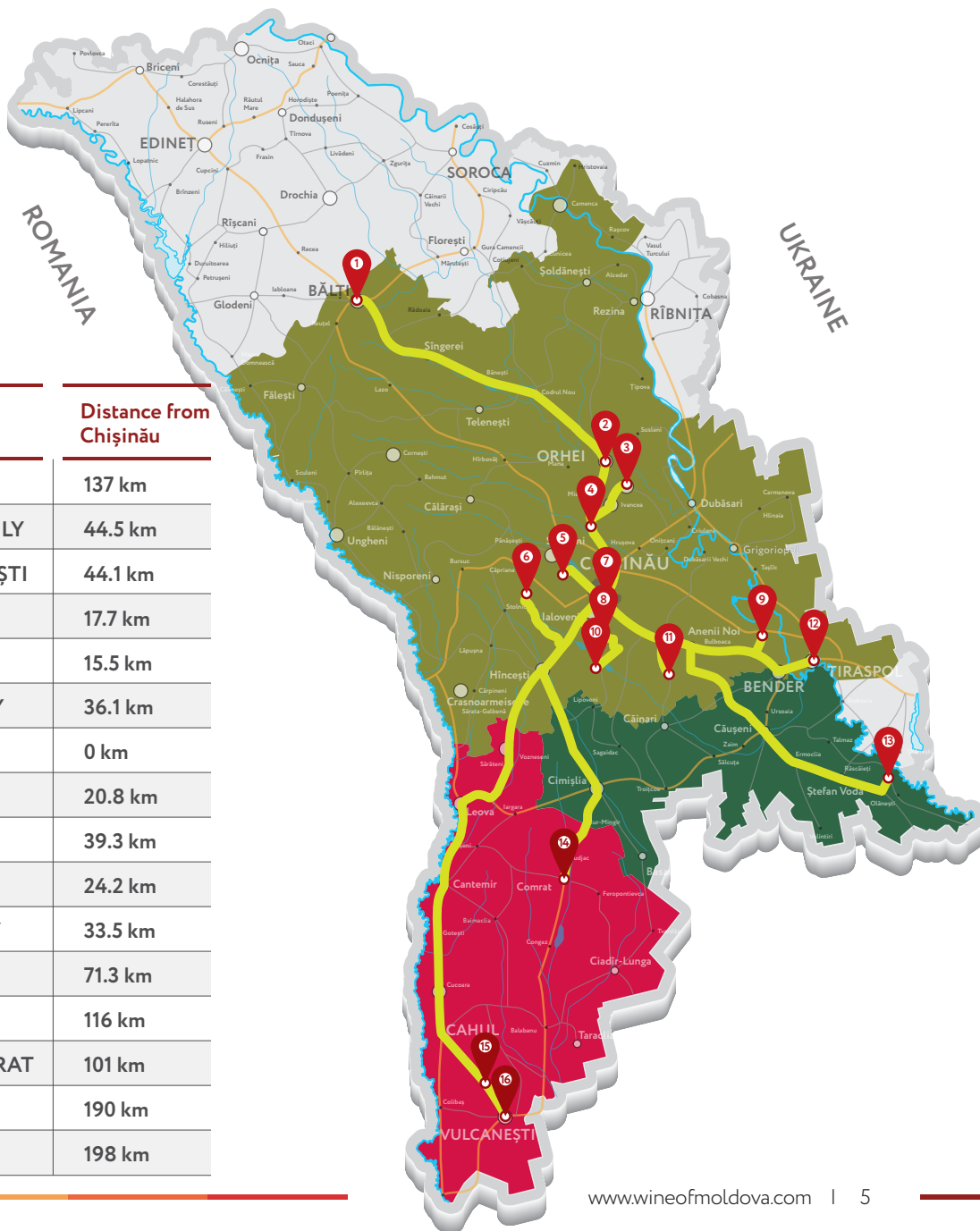
MOLDOVA WINE ROUTE MAP

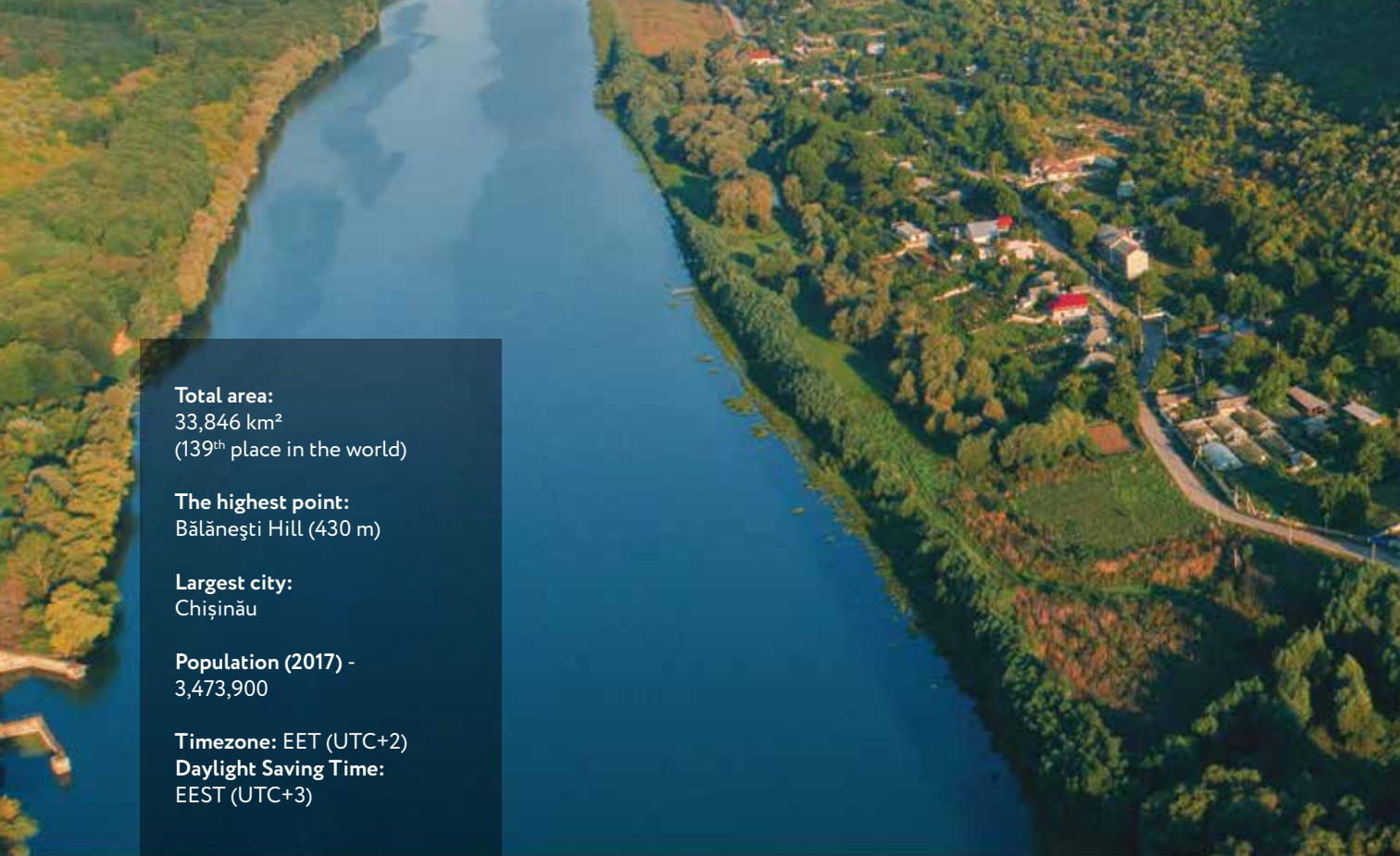

The Republic of Moldova is a country located in Eastern Europe, bordered by Ukraine to the east and Romania to the west. Its geographic location means that the country has a moderate continental climate with short (though sometimes very cold) winters and long summers. Moldova's landscapes vary considerably from endless steppes of the east, to forested hillsides of the central zone, and on to the vast Bugeac Plain in the south. It is becoming a popular tourist destination for its diversity of natural and cultural sites; its vineyards and wines; and its warm hospitality built on ancestral traditions and customs. Major tourist attractions include several medieval fortresses where visitors can take a journey into the Moldova's past and the historic monasteries that reveal the spiritual side of this nation.



Moldova is also internationally famous for its vast underground cellars at Cricova and at Mileștii Mici - the latter holds the Guinness World Record for the largest wine collection in the world. In the last few years the number of wineries open to tourists and visitors has doubled, offering a wonderful opportunity to get close to Moldovan wine, with a personal connection to the winemakers and their very human stories. Wine tastings are often accompanied by a taste of homemade local food too, based on locally sourced flavoursome ingredients, a reflection of Moldova's rich folklore and traditions.

Moldova's long history of winemaking began around 3000 BC, and the first traces of grapevines in these lands have been dated back to around 7000 BC. Throughout its history, wine and grapes have been deeply rooted in the culture, myths, folklore and legends of Moldova. Even the map of today's Republic of Moldova is shaped like a bunch of grapes. We have chosen the white stork, with its leading role in so many local legends, as the symbol of the Moldovan wine industry and of the continual rebirth of Moldovan wine. That is why a stylised image of a stork carrying a bunch of grapes is part of our national wine brand image – "Wine of Moldova. A legend alive".

Our vision statement says, "Our wine has been crafted by generations of winemakers in the largest cellars in the world, appreciated by consumers in both east and west and supported by legends that everyone can embrace," and we hope and believe that Moldova's wine can continue to win new friends all over the world.

That vision has been supported by a series of structural reforms, brought in by the National Office for Vine and Wine. This refocused Moldova's wine industry towards a new approach and brought with it a significant leap in quality. Since 2013, Moldova has embraced a quality system based on the EU model of protected geographical indications (PGI), established around three traditional vine growing areas and based around research into differences in climate and growing conditions. These are Valul lui Traian,



Ștefan Vodă and Codru plus a special geographical denomination for grape distillates called Divin. By 2018 there were more than 8600 hectares registered for PGI wines by 64 producers. A multi-stage monitoring system covers the entire production process and authorized professional tasters carry out organoleptic certification. A national wine and vine register is also work-in-progress in line with best practice in Europe and there are plans still in development for more specific protected designation of origin (PDO) wines. Practical results of these changes are now clear to see. In 2018 alone, Moldovan winemakers entered 32 international competitions and won 187 gold medals (including 5 Grand Gold, two Double Gold and one Platinum), 158 silver and 123 bronze medals. Moldova wineries regularly unite under the umbrella of the national wine brand “Wine of Moldova” to take part in a large number of trade fairs in Europe, North America and Asia Pacific. As a result, Moldovan wines are now sold in 63 countries, mostly in high-value European Union markets, registering steady growth over the last 5 years and underpinned by shared branding and marketing organized by ONVV.

Wine is also Moldova’s trump card in the development of tourism as the country’s attractions include a fascinating variety of wineries, as well as the largest wine cellars in the world. These were established in former limestone quarries with more than 200 kilometres of tunnels which can be driven through. The biggest wine collection in the world, registered in the Guinness Book of World Records, consists of more than 1.5 million bottles (and growing with every vintage). It is stored in Gothic-style niches at a depth of 80 metres in the underground galleries of Mileștii Mici, situated just 10 kilometres away from the capital Chișinău. Another striking symbol of Moldovan winemaking is the underground wine city of Cricova, which has galleries stretching over 70 kilometres. It was founded in 1952 and is Moldova’s biggest producer of sparkling wine. Cricova is also home to Moldova’s national wine collection, which features a number of historic wines including old vintages of Moselle, Bourgogne, Bordeaux and Port. The oldest bottle in the collection, and the only one of its kind in the world, is the wine known as Easter Jerusalem, which was produced in just a single batch in 1902.

MOLDOVA'S WINE REGIONS

VALUL LUI TRAIAN (Trajan's Wall)

This region lies in Moldova's south west, where you can still see remnants of two fortified walls built by Roman Emperor Trajan to protect his lands from barbarian invaders. The climate is Mediterranean, with warm, dry summers and mild winters moderated by the Black Sea and protected by the forests that grow on the Tigheci Hills. The soils are leached and carbonated chernozems, with some areas of sand and clay, with low fertility, providing very good conditions for viticulture. The region is divided into 3 sub-zones: the hills of Tigheci, the Bugeac Plain and the Prut Terraces and the landscape includes forests, steppe, plains and plateaux. This is the warmest and driest part of Moldova but also the highest with altitude going up to 310 metres, helping to retain freshness and balance in the wines. The region is particularly noted for red wines which make up 60% of production, but it is also famous for its sweet fortified wines (now called Pastoral) and full-flavoured whites.



ȘTEFAN VODĂ

This wine region is situated in the south east of Moldova, at an average altitude of just 120 metres, which includes terraces along the Dniester river, plains and slopes. The climate here is moderate continental, influenced by the Black Sea, and has an annual rainfall of 450–550 millimetres. Typical soils are podzolized and carbonated chernozems with clay in some areas. The region is particularly noted for red grapes. Rară Neagră is particularly notable here - an indigenous variety to the region (it grows as Băbească Neagră in eastern Romania). Whether it's the particular clones found in Moldova, or the growing conditions, this grape offers its best expression here and it is also a key ingredient in one of the country's most renowned wine blends: Negru de Purcari. Other local and European varieties which perform well in this region include Merlot, Fetească Neagră, Saperavi, Pinot Noir, Pinot Gris and Chardonnay.

CODRU

This is Moldova's central region, extended in 2016 to include Bălți and vineyards in Transnistria. It Moldova's coolest zone, full of wooded hills and slopes around many small river valleys. Oak and linden forests cover 25% of the landscape protecting the vineyards from northerly winds and frost. Soils here are typically grey forest soils and chernozems. Winters are long, but not usually extreme, while summers and autumns are warm and altitude above sea level is 100–150 metres. The region is noted for white grapes, especially Fetească Albă, Muscat Ottonel, Sauvignon Blanc and Chardonnay, and also suitably crisp base wines for sparkling wines. Red varieties can also be grown in warmer microclimates, especially for the noted Codru blend. The famous underground wine cellars Cricova and Mileștii Mici are located in this region.



DIVIN

This PGI covers the whole of the Republic of Moldova and is for spirits distilled from wine through double distillation and aged for at least 3 years in contact with oak. Divin is produced from a range of both international and local grape varieties, which must be grown within the country. Most typical varieties include: Aligoté, Chardonnay, Fetească Albă, Luminita, Pinot, Riton, Rkatsiteli, Sauvignon and blends of these varieties. Divin is appealing and clear to look at, with colour ranging from pale gold to amber, a bouquet of flowers and fruit when young but with further ageing, it gains notes of vanilla, chocolate, sandalwood, coconut and coffee beans.

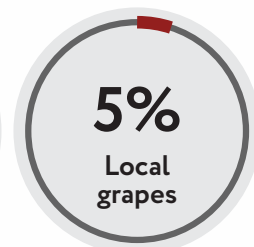
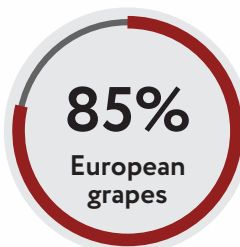

GRAPE VARIETIES IN MOLDOVA

Viticulture in Moldova includes cultivation of Western European, Black Sea Basin and indigenous grape varieties. Vineyards of wine varieties of the noble *Vitis Vinifera* cover a total area of 81,000 hectares, 70% of which are white varieties (especially Rkatsiteli, Sauvignon Blanc, Chardonnay, Aligoté though exact plantings won't be finalized until the vineyard register is complete) located predominantly in the Codru region, and 30% are red varieties (Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Pinot Noir, Saperavi and more), typically grown in the southern regions. Aromatic varieties account for around one third of the vineyards. Local grape varieties (such as Rară Neagră, Fetească Neagră, Fetească Albă, Viorica) are becoming increasingly important as a point of difference and to offer something with real Moldovan character. These currently account for an estimated 5% of vineyards though this is growing every year due to increasing international interest and thanks to support from government programs.



FETEASCA ALBA

This variety has been cultivated for centuries in this region and appears to be a very ancient grape. The wines of this variety are fine and delicate, with floral aromas and a light and fresh body. It's one of the parents of Fetească Regală (along with Frâncușă) which comes from Transylvania in Romania but has been grown in the Moldovan region for decades.



FETEASCA REGALA

This a semi-aromatic grape variety is the result of a natural cross, found near Sighișoara in Romania in 1920s. It has typical floral and grapefruit aromas and flavours of fresh pear and citrus but is usually more full-bodied and textured than its parent.



FETEASCA NEAGRA

This is an old variety local to the region, possibly cultivated as early as Geto-Dacian times, in south east Romania and what is today's Republic of Moldova. It is relatively pale in colour with gentle soft tannins and spicy berry fruit. It seems particularly well suited to the sunny slopes of southern Moldova.



RARA NEAGRA

A local cross developed in Moldova in 1969 from Seibel 13666 and Aleatico. It was originally bred for distillation and cold resistance, but it is proving well suited to making aromatic but very fresh crisp white wines and a number of wineries are now producing this.



UNIQUE EXPERIENCES TO TREASURE FOREVER

We have a full calendar of concerts, festivals, races, wine run, and even a marathon. Every year, thousands of Moldovans participate in these events, so why not join them? In the autumn, first weekend of October, come to the largest holiday “National Wine Day”, dedicated to the millennial tradition in winemaking that reached the 18th edition. Another big event where you must come is “Ethno Jazz’ festival to hear folk and jazz musicians from around the world. In the summer, visit “DescOpera”, a three-days opera festival, to hear spine-tingling performance in an open air amphitheater. In the depths of winter, head to our underground wine cellars for either music, at “Underland Fest”, or exercise, with the 10 km Wine Run. Whatever you choose, the memories you make in Moldova will last a lifetime.

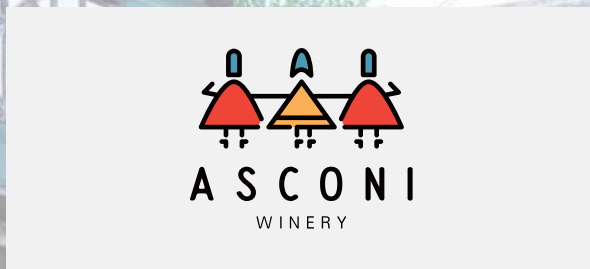
MOLDOVAN HOSPITALITY

It's the people that make Moldova special. Travel to any corner of Moldova and you will be welcomed by genuinely warm and friendly people and food is at the centre of that welcome. When you arrive in a Moldovan village, before you know it you will be at a table groaning with food, accompanied by local wine, sometimes made by your host or from a winery nearby.

Our national cuisine may surprise you with its simplicity and yet richness of flavour, based on our local production from our fertile black soils. Meals often start with soup, and a favourite is a hot and sour soup called Zeamă, cooked with homemade noodles. Main courses are typically accompanied by Mămăligă - a dish made from cornmeal (similar to polenta). It's always cut in a cross with a thread and served with Moldovan cheese (a salty white cheese called Brânza), sour cream and a meat stew called Tocană.

Most households make their own home-made versions of our famous pastries called Plăcintă (or Plăcintele). These are made from layers of flaky pastry with a variety of fillings: cabbage, local cheese, apple, pumpkin or cherry. The cheesy versions are particularly good at wine tastings. Sarmale or dumplings, as they are sometimes called, are popular across the whole of Moldova. Sarmale are parcels or rolls made from cabbage or grapevine leaves. These are stuffed with a mixture of minced meat (usually pork) rice and herbs. Each region has its own slightly different recipe and sarmale are usually served with mămăligă and sour cream, or with home-baked bread. Moldova's home-grown vegetables are incredible – fresh salads feature in season as well as dishes based on peppers, aubergines and tomatoes. Desserts may be smoked plums stuffed with walnuts (Moldova's roadsides are lined with walnut trees), or look out for the slow baked traditional cake called Baba Neagră.





Located only 30 km from Chişinău, Asconi offers everything a tourist could wish for: beautiful landscapes, rustic architecture, tasty food and great wines. Tours include a visit to the winemaking, storage, packaging, bottling and maturation facilities, where visitors can see the full journey of the grapes, how they are processed, fermented and turned into wine. After seeing the technical side of winemaking, visitors are invited to enjoy a guided wine tasting of up to 7 different wines of their choice: red, white or rosé, and aged in oak or young fresh styles. Asconi is one of the very few wineries in the country to make three different types of Ice Wine that have all won awards in international competitions. After seeing the modern production halls, guests head to a relaxing oasis – the stone and clay restaurant and its wooden veranda are perfect for discovering how Asconi wines can partner traditional Moldovan cuisine. The menu is based on recipes from households in the nearby village of Puhoi, passed down from generation to generation.

WINERY

ATU Winery is the first urban winery in Moldova. It's located in Chisinau and is open to visitors and for events all year round. ATU wines are produced in very small batches of just 1000-3000 bottles, which allows us to pay complete attention to every single drop of wine. All our wines are made by hand, from harvesting to labelling, with the whole process taking place on site. Owner and winemaker Victor will be on hand to greet visitors, tell the ATU story and explain all about our wines.

Our wine range is centred on local varieties including Viorica, Fetească Albă, Fetească Neagră, and the rare red Codrinschii. ATU is a new brand, released for the first in 2016, but already building a reputation for its unique wines, hand-crafted in limited quantities.

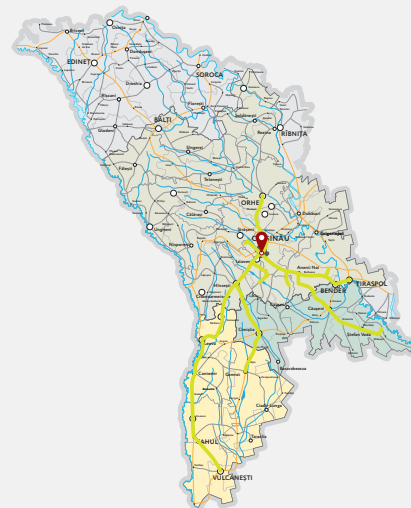

FONDAT 1944

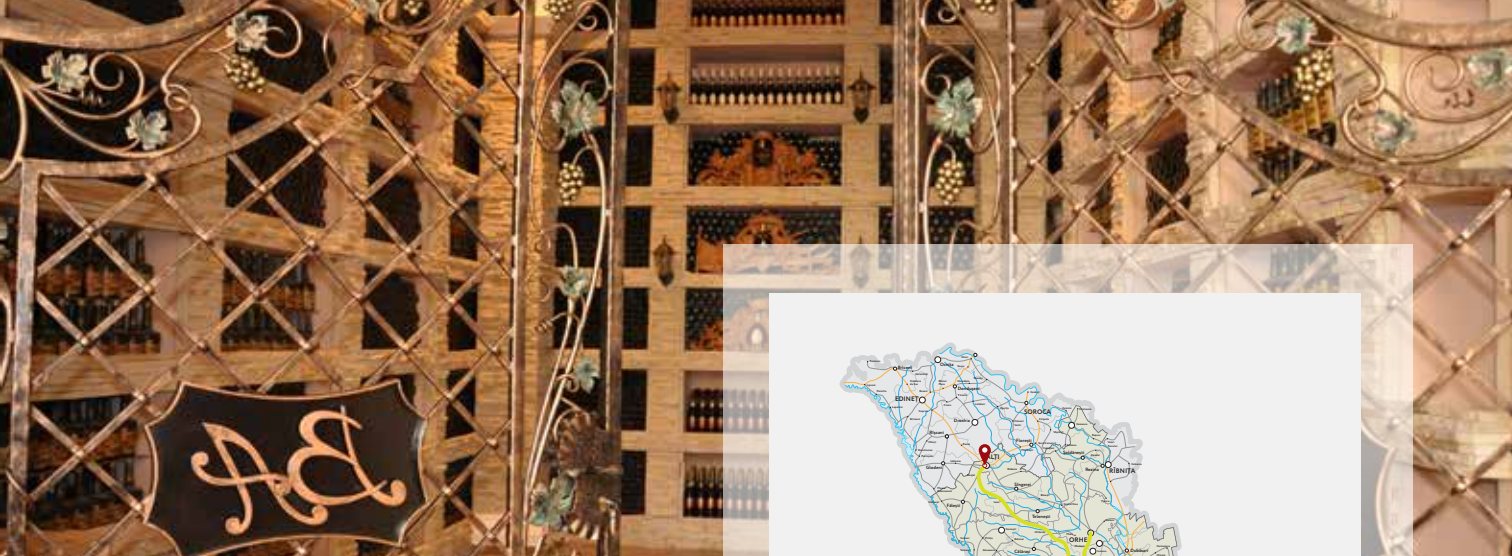
Located just 135 km from Chişinău, the Barza Albă Divin distillery offers a wonderful experience for the enthusiastic wine tourist. This includes beautiful landscapes near the distillery, flavoursome snacks and remarkable divins. Visitors can see the whole production process and equipment used to make divin and visit the maturation halls, full of oak casks. After getting acquainted with divin production, we offer visitors a guided tasting of up to 10 different styles of divin as well as an apple cider brandy. Tourists can choose from several tasting packages: divin categories include VS, VSOP, XO, XXO. Our own sommelier will be happy to explain the history and characteristics of divin and other brandies, and will guide visitors to learn how to distinguish the styles, flavours and colours of the different products.

The Barza Albă Divin distillery is proud that it is one of the few in the country that has been awarded 150 medals, of which 80 are gold. It has also won 10 Grand Prix and a Star award for special quality. In 2003, the company was awarded a Grand Prize for its significant successes in winemaking and for promotion of Moldovan divins on the international market. In 2004 and 2005 the company won National Awards for fair competition.

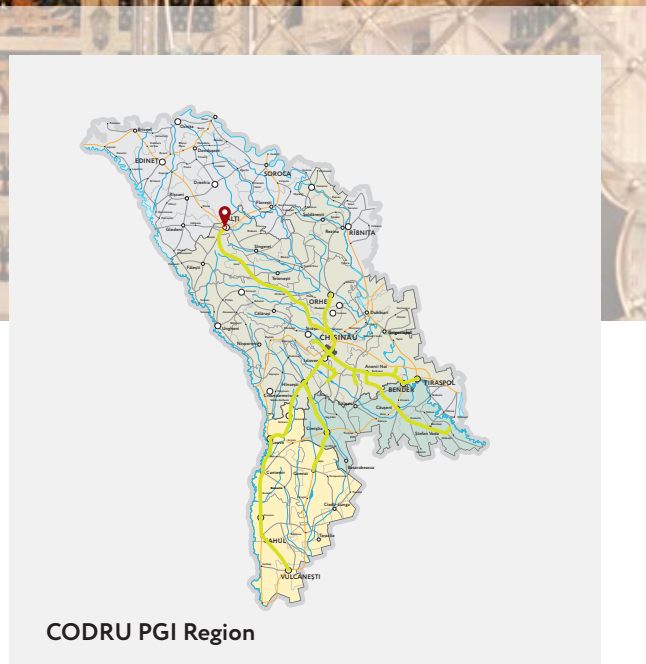

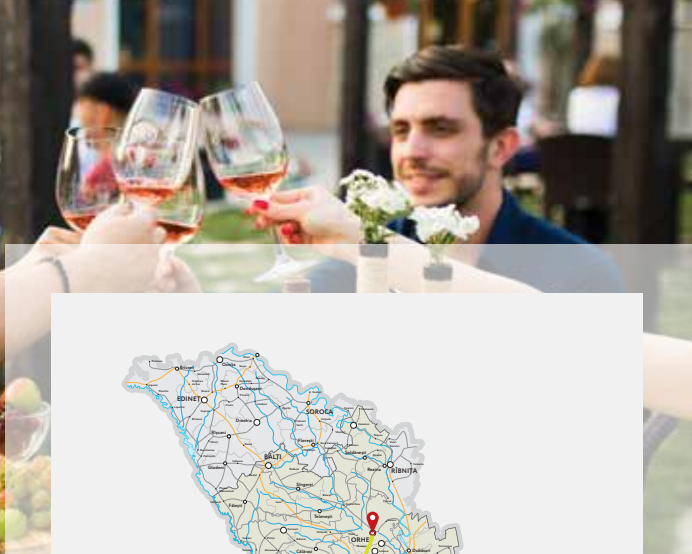

CRICOVA

Cricova is one most renowned wineries in Moldova, especially noted for its 'underground city'. The unique labyrinth of tunnels, created from a former limestone quarry, houses 30 million litres of wine and stretches over a distance of 70 km. The streets of the underground city are named after the wines kept in adjacent niches: Cabernet, Chardonnay, Sauvignon etc. Some of the streets are as deep as 80 metres below ground, which ensures constant humidity and temperature throughout the year. This makes it an ideal place to store the National Wine Collection that includes the best local and international wines; wines from Herman Goering's collection paid as retribution after World War II and unique vintages from Moselle, Bourgogne and Bordeaux. The oldest wine in the collection is Ierusalimul de Paști (Easter Jerusalem) produced in 1902, unique in the world. Cricova was also the first winery in Moldova to produce sparkling wine by the traditional method of bottle fermentation and has won recognition for its quality at highly-regarded international competitions such as Effervescents du Monde. Famous personalities also hold wine collections in these underground galleries, among them are Angela Merkel, John Kerry, Vladimir Putin and Donald Tusk.

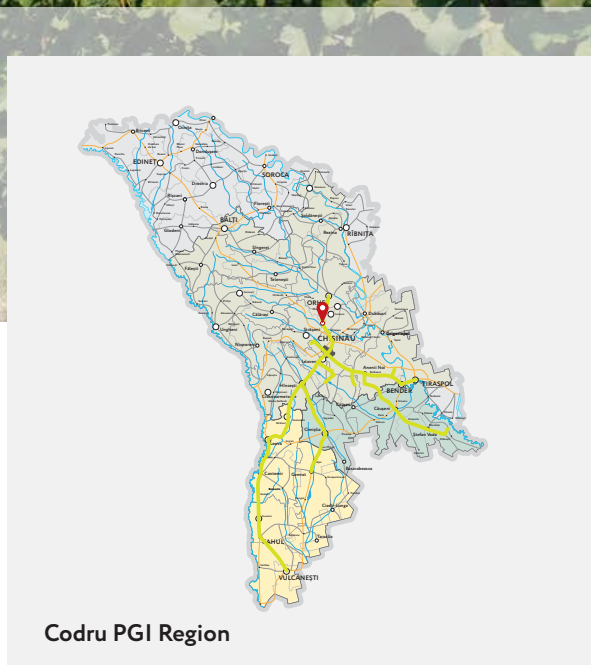

Castel Mimi was founded in 1893, when Constantin Mimi, the last governor of Bessarabia, planted the first vine cuttings at his estate in Bulboaca in the Anenii-Noi district. In 2011, an ambitious restoration project was initiated to renovate the mansion, which has been rebuilt stone by stone to restore its original facade. After a period of 50 years of inactivity, Castel Mimi, the only wine castle in the Republic of Moldova, reopened its doors to visitors. Today, Castel Mimi has been listed among top 14 most beautiful architectural masterpieces of the winemaking world by Vivino. Besides its stunning architecture, Castel Mimi has built a reputation for its unique gastronomy thanks to an exquisite menu of traditional dishes reinterpreted as modern 'haute cuisine' using fresh, locally-sourced ingredients. The speciality of the house is its chicken paté with pickles, made from chicken breast and liver, and cooked to a secret recipe. Also worth trying is the traditional dessert Baba Neagră, slow baked for hours and served with vanilla cream and plum sauce. Castel Mimi's exquisite, award-winning wines are served to accompany the menu. The tourist complex of the winery includes a royal courtyard with evergreen gardens; a grand square with dancing fountains; a multi-purpose events hall; a wine spa, a swimming pool; a summer terrace and picnic areas. Overnight accommodation is available in seven chalet-style cottages.

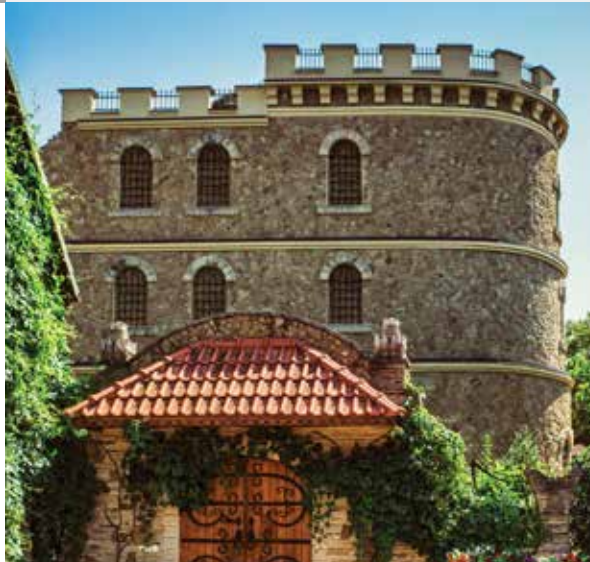

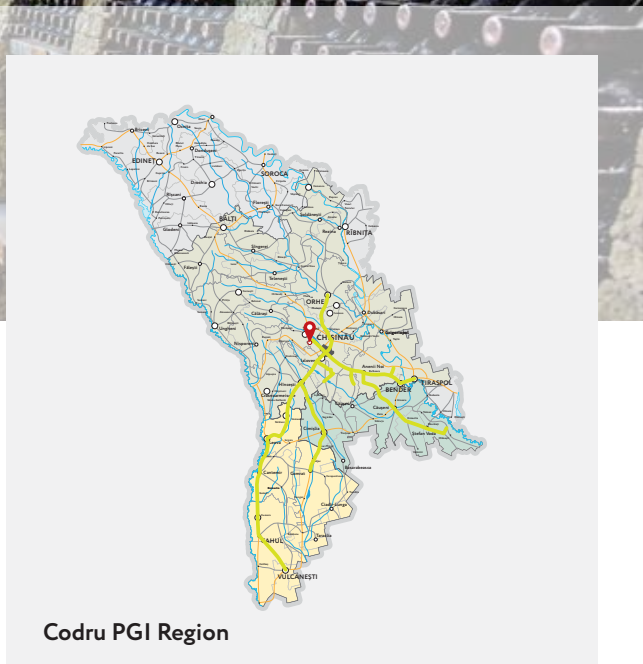

The Mileștii Mici wine cellar was included in the Guinness Book of World Records in 2005 for the largest wine collection in the world, of more than 1.5 million bottles. It is also known as the Golden Collection. It is kept deep below ground and includes many unique Moldovan wines going back to the 1969 vintage. The underground galleries of Mileștii Mici are probably the longest in the world, stretching for over 200 kilometres. Visitors can walk through the underground avenues and streets that bear the names of grape varieties, and are large enough to be driven through by car. After experiencing the dramatic cellars, guests are welcomed to the tasting room to sample the wines along with traditional dishes such as sarmale and mămăligă with goat cheese and meat stew.

Kvint winery and distillery is located in Tiraspol and is one of the largest producers of wines and wine distillates in the region. Kvint produces a wide range of dry, semi-dry and dessert wines, vermouths, vodkas and other liquors, but the calling card of the winery is its wine distillates: Divins. These spirits are aged in hundreds of oak barrels, which store around 11 million litres, the oldest dated 1951. The winery owns a museum where tourists can see historic labels, bottles and photos telling the story of the company, which dates back to 1897. One special exhibit is a bottle that travelled to space in 1998, taken by Russian astronauts to the MIR space station. Another 'artefact' is a bottle of Kvint Divin that was taken to the Vatican, where it was blessed by Pope John Paul II. Kvint is also the sole producer of kosher Divin, prepared under the strict supervision of rabbis of the Union of Jewish Congregations in New York and exported to Israel and USA.

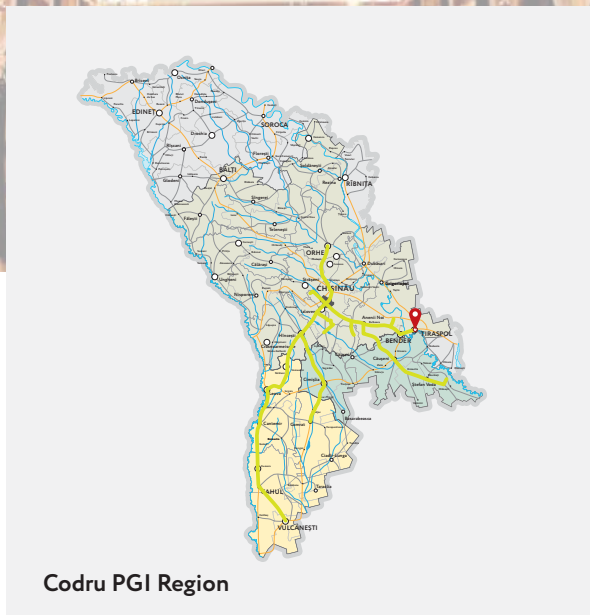

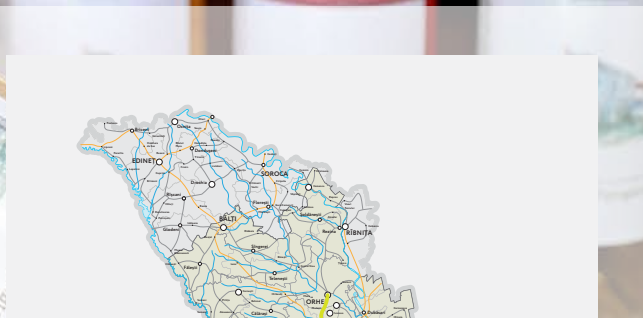
Mihai Sava

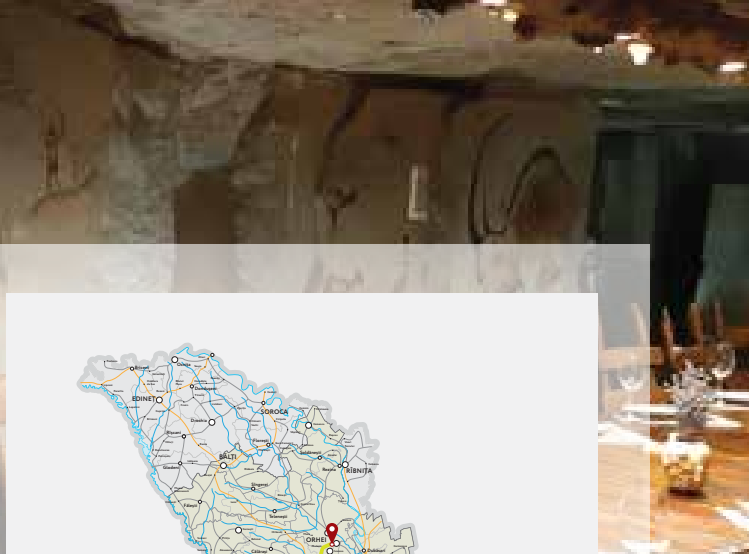

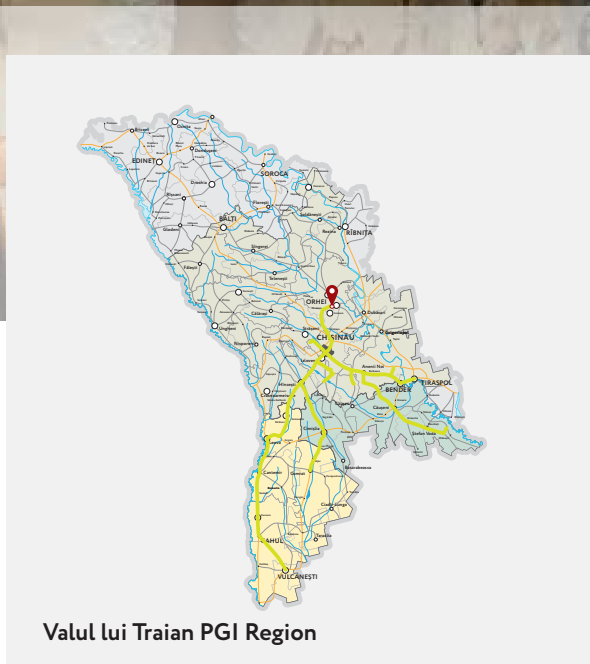

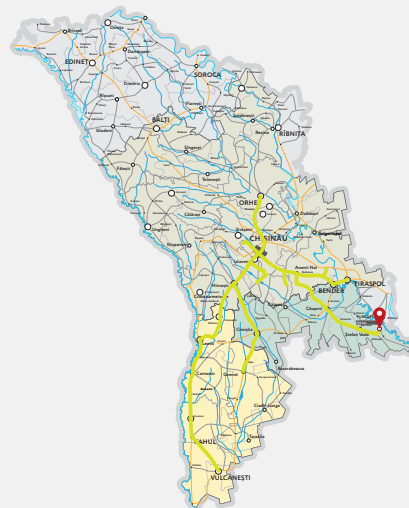

Vinia Traian was established in 1975 and is located in southern Moldova in the village of Gavanoasa close to the borders with both Romania and Ukraine. The winery itself is close to its own vineyards which are planted slopes of the Bugeac Plain and across Trajan's Wall. This area is considered to be the cradle of noble winemaking in the region, based on long multi-secular traditions. Here, the bouquet of wine can take visitors back into history to discover ancient local cultures and traditions, to experience the taste of grapes grown by the ancient Romans and to learn about the five thousand year old Scythian burial mounds, the historic fortification that was Emperor Trajan's Wall and the events of the Russian-Turkish War. Kara Gani is a small family winery with vineyards in southern Moldova, near the town of Vulcănești. A combination of the ideal climate, modern technology and old Gagauz winemaking traditions help the Cerven family to produce high quality wines. TOURIST DESTINATIONS IN MOLDOVA



SOROCA FORTRESS

The Soroca Fortress was built in the 15th century and is the only fortress in the whole of Moldova to survive intact to the present day. It's notable for its architectural system of fortification: five towers joined by walls form a circular enclosure, a structure able to withstand heavy artillery and siege attacks. The Soroca fortress is contemporaneous with the Italian Renaissance and it shares features with many fortifications in Northern Italy (such as the castle at Caprarola and Castel Del Monte). The Soroca fortress also shares resemblances with Queenborough, Walmer and Deal castles in Kent, England. In its history, the Soroca Fortress has stood witness to some of worst battles and wars across this territory.



TIGHINA FORTRESS

The Tighina Fortress, located on the bank of the Dniester River, was one of the strongest fortresses of Moldova. During the 1470s to 1480s, Tighina was incorporated into the Principality of Moldavia. It became an important point on the Moldovan Trade Route, also known as the Tartar Road. This connected Western Europe with the Orient through the Danube ford at Isaccea as well as linking Byzantine regions on the right bank of the Danube with Caffa and Genoese colonies in Crimea. The road crossed by Tighina with links to other medieval fortresses at Hotin, Soroca, Cetatea Albă, and to the Black Sea. The Tighina Fortress became a key location in both military and civilian terms. It played an important role during decisive historical events for Moldova, Russia and the Ottoman Empire. In 1709, Swedish King Carol XII and Ukrainian Cossack hetman (leader) Ivan Mazepa took sanctuary in the city for an extended period. According to legend, Mazepa's chariot, made of pure gold, is still hidden in the Tighina fortress and the crown of Carol XII remains hidden somewhere in the dungeons. Tourists can visit the site of the fortress as well as two nearby museums: the Tighina Fortress History Museum and the Museum of Torture.

CULTURAL, NATURAL AND LANDSCAPE RESERVE “ORHEIUL VECHI”



The natural and cultural reserve of Orheiul Vechi (Old Orhei) includes several historic and cultural monuments as well as the natural landscapes of the Răut River gorge. This area has been populated, and partially urbanized, since Palaeolithic and Neolithic times. Its history of several millennia covers the Dacian civilization in the 5th-3rd centuries BC; the remnants of the medieval city Sehr al-Cedid, built by Tatar-Mongols in the 14th century and the village of Old Orhei, built by Moldovans in the 15th-16th centuries. In the limestone cliffs, visitors can see a Christian cave monastery with cells and religious inscriptions carved into the stone by the monks in the medieval and modern ages. The geology of the area is of rare beauty, with steep cliffs soaring to heights of 170-180 m. The reserve is currently on the list of candidate sites for UNESCO World Heritage status.

TIPOVA MONASTERY



The Tipova Monastery is located above the Dniester river approximately 100 km north of Chişinău, 40 km from the town of Rezina and 45 km from Orhei. It is one of the most beautiful monasteries in Moldova and is comprised of three monastic complexes carved into the rock. The first complex consists of several cells and a chapel dedicated to the “Exaltation of the Holy Cross” that dates back to the 11th-12th centuries. The chapel dedicated to “Saint Nicholas” was the centre of the second monastic complex, founded in the 14th century. The largest cluster of cells is located around the chapel dedicated to the “Assumption of Virgin Mary”, which dates back to the 16th-18th centuries. Nearby along several kilometres of river bank, hundreds of ancient and historical artefacts have been discovered. This is a unique landscape with incredible archaeological diversity: ancient villages and towns, castles, churches and cemeteries have been dug into the steep bank.

CAPRIANA MONASTERY



The Capriana Monastery is dedicated to the “Assumption of Virgin Mary”. It’s located in the village of Capriana, 36 km northwest of Chişinău and 16 km from Straseneni and is one of the oldest monasteries of Bessarabia. The first documentary reference mentioning the church dates back to 1420. Because it had the status of a royal monastery, several princes of Moldova ensured its monastic endowment. The monastery, which was built at first of wood, suffered from the repeated invasions by the Tatars and Turks. Stefan the Great was the founder of the stone church at the site in 1491-1496. In Soviet times, Capriana monastery, as with all the places of worship in the Moldovan SSR, suffered greatly and its wealth passed into state ownership. In 1962 it was closed and left to fall into ruin. Only in 1989, when the national liberation of Moldova began, was the monastery reopened.

SAHARNA MONASTERY



The Saharna Monastery is located 8 km from the town of Rezina, 60 km from the town of Orhei and 110 km from Chişinău. This monastic complex is also a nature reserve under government protection and covers an area of 670 ha of land. Originally, the monastic complex included a small hermitage (Horodiste) and a small chapel carved into rock celebrating the Annunciation. In 1776, monk Vortolomeu Crungul, and a group of other monks, came from Russia and settled the complex. They repaired the chapel and its cells. In 1863, at the time of Abbot Serafim, another chapel for winter orations and a series of cells were constructed. This chapel celebrates the Holy Virgin Mother of God. It has been renovated recently and new frescoes have been painted. Saharna is also famous for its 22 waterfalls. One of the most beautiful is very close to the monastery, falling from a height of 10 metres and forming a deep pool called the “Gipsy Hole”.

HANCU MONASTERY



Hancu Monastery is dedicated to “Saint Pious Paraskeva” and is located about 70 km west of Chişinău and 32 km from Straseneni. In 1678, a new sanctuary was founded, carrying the name of the protector of Moldova – Pious Paraskeva. It’s believed that the monastery itself was founded by the Moldovan boyar (leader), Mihalcea Hancu. In 1817, a wooden church was built at the monastery. It had a wooden iconostasis decorated with flowers gilded with gold leaf. The walls inside the church were decorated with many beautiful icons, eight of which were painted on planks of wood and gilded. Hancu was the first monastic settlement of Bessarabia where religious community life was introduced, in approximately 1820-1822.

CURCHI MONASTERY



Curchi Monastery is dedicated to the “Nativity of Virgin Mary” and is located in the village of Curchi, Orhei district, 12 km from Orhei and 55 km from Chişinău. The monastery has a rich religious and cultural past spanning over two centuries. It was founded in 1773-1775 and became one of the richest, most beautiful, and largest monasteries in Moldova. Several churches were built on the monastery’s premises: St. Demetrius, a wooden church built in 1775 by Ioan Curchi; Naşterea Domnului (Nativity), a stone church built in 1810; the winter church of St. Demetrius built in 1844; the summer church also Naşterea Domnului (Nativity) built in 1872; and the winter church of St. Nicholas (unfinished), built in 1936-1939. The monastery’s main church, the Nativity cathedral (1872), is built in baroque style, inspired by the church of St. Andrew in Kiev, which was designed by the Italian architect Bartolomeo Rastrelli. The cathedral has the highest dome in Moldova, rising to a height of 57 metres

NOUL NEAMT MONASTERY



The Noul Neamt Monastery is an Orthodox monastery located on the banks of the Dniester river, about 105 km east of Chişinău, 30 km from Causeni and 20 km from Tiraspol. The monastery was founded in 1861, when several monks from the Neamţ monastery left and founded Noul-Neamţ in Chiţcani. This action was a protest against measures taken in United Principalities of Romania to confiscate monastic estates and forbid the use of the Slavic language in worship. On May 16th, 1962 Soviet authorities closed the monastery and the buildings became a hospital. The monastery church was reopened in 1989 and from 1991 it hosted the Romanian-language school for Orthodox priests.

TAXI

Moldova's taxi service is the most convenient method of travel for tourists in Chişinău. Within the city limits, it will cost you about 50-70 lei (3€ -5€). A trip to the airport and outside the city will be charged per km. You can call a taxi using a phone app – iTaxi, Yandex Taxi Chisinau – or by calling one of the following numbers:

TROLLEYBUSES

There is an extensive trolleybus public transport network within the capital Chişinău as well as other major cities (Bălţi, Bender, Tiraspol). Trolleybuses run between 5 am and 1 am. A trolleybus ticket costs 2 lei (€0.11). It is the cheapest method of transport within the metropolitan zone.

BUSES

Public bus services are available in almost every mid-sized to large city in Moldova. Every public bus stop displays a timetable for buses and trolleybuses. A bus ticket costs 3 lei (€0.16)

INTERNET IN MOLDOVA

Internet in Moldova is one of the fastest and cheapest in the world. The country ranks 3rd in the world by gigabit coverage with around 90% of the population having access to a fast service. Visitors to the country may opt for pre-paid mobile data packages, usually operating at 4G speeds, from one of three mobile operators. A wide network of WiFi hotspots is available, some, located in public places like parks are free. The overall infrastructure is well developed so users should experience good quality services throughout the country.

In Moldova, power sockets are of type C and F. The standard voltage is 220 V and the standard frequency is 50 Hz

NATIONAL OFFICE FOR VINE AND WINE - PROMOTING THE WINE SECTOR

The National Office for Vine and Wine (ONVV) is the main body that manages the Moldovan wine sector. It is organized through a public-private partnership, and was created with government support after sector reforms in response to various external and internal industry challenges.

The ONVV's scope is to develop and implement state policies in the wine sector, including vine and grape growing and promotion of quality wines through the national country brand "Wine of Moldova. A Legend Alive". It also manages the production of PGI and PDO wines and provides technical assistance and consultancy to the Moldovan wine industry.

In the short period of time since its foundation, the ONVV has established itself as the leading source of expertise in the Moldovan wine sector. It has contributed to legal and regulatory reform, and serves as a united platform for the reputation and marketability of Moldovan wine.

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
